HeartStrings Pattern: H32 - 4106

Pleasing Reversibility in Lace



Pleasing Reversibility in Lace is the answer to a completely wearable stole.

The design features reversible double diamond motifs silhouetted by eyelets. A knit-as-you-go textured lace border frames the entire piece.

Throw it on and go! The lace stitch patterns are designed to be pleasing on both sides, making this stole look great no matter which way you wear.

Finished Size 22" wide by 70" long

Materials and Supplies

780 yards fingering weight yarn; shown in Crystal Palace *Mini Mochi* color #332 Napa Valley (takes 4 - 50g/195 yard balls)

Size US 8 (5 mm) knitting needles suggested

Gauge 16 stitches and 21 rows = 4" over double diamonds stitch pattern after blocking

Skill Level Intermediate

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Construction Knitted flat from end to end in one piece; no seams to sew

Spring Raindrops Lace Leaves Scarf

Sparkly beads glisten like raindrops, greeting the awakening of Spring's first leaves.



Size 48" by 6" after blocking

Materials and Supplies

165 yards fingering weight yarn; sample shown is hand spun 80/20 merino/mohair dyed roving plied with silk noil

Size 6 US (4 mm) knitting needles suggested

318 size 6/0 (4 mm diameter) glass seed beads (approximately 27 g)

Crochet hook or similar that is small enough to fit through the hole in beads

Gauge Approximately 20 stitches = 4" over blocked lace patterns

Skill Level Advanced beginner

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Beading Technique Crochet hook method

Construction Knit-as-you-go edging; 2 halves joined with no-knit pull-over bind off

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HeartStrings Pattern: H92 - 3327

Bead Skinny Skarf

Bead Skinny Skarf is a play on words, reflecting on the fashion of cinching in a waist to look skinny. Bead Skinny gives the illusion of cinching the curvy lines of the faux eyelet cable with a pretty bead.

A bonus is pleasing reversibility thanks to how the ribbed texture surrounding the lozenges of eyelets and the beads are equally prominent on both the right side and wrong side.



Finished Size Approximately 5" at widest by 40" long

Materials and Supplies

1 ball Aunt Lydia's Fashion Crochet (Size 3) 100% cotton 150 yards/50g or equivalent fingering weight yarn; shown in color Copper Mist

Size US 6 (4 mm) knitting needles suggested

Gauge: Approximately 6 stitches / inch over blocked stitch pattern

46 Crow Beads size 9 mm diameter by 6 mm height or similar large beads; shown in Red Opaque

For placing beads: US steel size 4 crochet hook or similar that is small enough to fit through the hole in beads

Beading Technique Crochet hook method

Construction Worked end-to-end in one piece; no seams to sew

Tea-time Serviette

A featured project in the Beyond BOBBOL 2014 Series at the KnitHeartStrings.com membership site

Tea-time Serviette gives tea time a double meaning. After knitting the lace, dye it with tea for a vintage look. Then add the pretty lace napkin to your tea service for a nostalgic setting.



Size 8" (20 cm) square

Materials and Supplies

Approximately 80 yards (73 m) of size 10 cotton crochet thread in color white, or equivalent non-synthetic fine yarn in white or other light color if you plan to tea dye

Size 2 US (2.75 mm) knitting needles suggested; circular and/or double point needles

Note: You will be knitting in-the-round, so you may use your choice of any type of needles (or combination) for knitting circularly. I used a 24" (60 cm) circular needle to start, then changed to a 16" (40 cm) circular, then a set of 5 double point needles.

176 size 8/0 (3 mm diameter) beads, approximately 5 g; I used pearl white to contrast slightly with the after-dyed thread

Bead stringing needle or nylon dental floss threader

4 markers

6 - 8 tea bags and a non-staining bowl/pot

Gauge Approximately 26 stitches = 4" (10 cm)

Stitch Instructions Charted and written

Special Technique Long tail beaded cast on; petit scalloped edging; easy cold-brew tea dyeing

Construction Circular outside-in; one piece; no seams to sew

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
