Elegant and simple, these lightweight dressy scarves all are made in one piece. Using a fine lace-weight yarn and worked on larger needles than you might expect, the knitting goes quickly. And at the finale, there is always a magic moment when the lace is blocked out to show all of its airy beauty. A blocking tutorial is included.

# HeartStrings Pattern: A20 - 9347 Crest of the Wave Lace Scarf This lovely lace scarf is named after its main pattern stitch "Crest of the Wave" - a derivative of the popular Shetland lace stitch Feather and Fan or Old Shale. The ma stitch area of graceful lacy waves is surrounded by a knit-as-you-go elegant ribbed openwork border. Yarn and Needles 500 yards lace weight or light weight fingering yarn. Size 6 US (4.0 mm) knitting needles Gauge Average of 4% stitches per inch over combination of border and main patterns after blocking unor tension. SAIR Level Advanced beginner. ### Cat's Cradle Long-Ways Scarf

The clustered threads used as the main pattern stitch in this scarf concentrate the colors of variegated yarn in a lovely way. Also, the way the threads meet and cross each other reminds me of the child's game "cat's cradle".

By knitting from one long edge to the other, the colors arrange themselves in strokes of color along the length of the scarf. The eyelet stripe sections which frame and divide the cat's cradle areas further emphasize the length-wise color placement.

Includes a mini-tutorial on finishing and blocking lace.



#### **Yarn and Needles**

450 yards of laceweight or light fingering weight yarn for blocked measurements of 65° by 70°. To achieve a look similar to the mos choose a variegated yarn with color runs of 10 inches or more.

Size 5 US (3.75 mm) knitting needles

Gauge: Average of 5 sts and 9 rows per inch over stitch patterns after blocking

See the Design Notes for making shorter or longer, narrower or wider, and with whatever yarn you want. Remember that the amount of yarn you need will vary as you make these types of adjustments.

Scarf pictured was made in Heritage Yarns 8/2 Tencel, color Summer Haze.



#### Willared Archways Lace Scarf



This graceful rectangular scarf is knitted in a double chevron-arched stockinette lace stitch pattern bordered by pillared columns of an interesting knotted stitch.

Sizing, Yarn and Needles Approximately 375 yards of fine years for blocked measurements of 10° by 54°. This scarf is knitted from end to end and can easily be adjusted for length. Allow additional yarn if "methesizing."

Size 6 US (4.0 mm) knitting

Gauge: Average of 5 stitches per inch over combination of border and main patterns afto blocking under tension.

Charted and written stitch instructions are included.

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
