

Classic great fitting ribbed socks with distinctive styling. Easy-toknit left and right-angled lines of eyelets embellish ribbing on legs.

Another design feature is the subtle "eye of partridge" diamond pattern on the heel flap, an interesting yet easy variation of the common slip-stitch heel.
This is a good basic pattern for a beginner learning to knit socks in a traditional method, as detailed counts for stitch placement on each of the needles is given throughout the instructions.
Even for more experienced sock knitters, the sock design itself makes an interesting and enjoyable knit. So much so, that you may want to continue to use this basic design as a template for variations of other socks you create.

Pictured socks were knitted with one ball of Kraemer Yarns Saucon Sock $44 \%$ cotton / $43 \%$ acrylic / $13 \%$ nylon, 1 ball 430 yards / 100 grams, color Coral.

## Sizing

Adult medium with planned measurements of 8 " sock leg height above heel flap, $7^{1 / 2} \mathbf{1}^{\prime \prime}$ sock foot circumference un-stretched, and $91 / 2 "$ foot length. Foot length is easily adjustable to specific measurements of wearer as indicated in the instructions

## Yarn and Needles

Fingering weight sock yarn (15-17 wraps per inch), approximately 400 yards. If you will be making longer foot length than stated above, please allow more yarn.
Set of 5 double point knitting needles, size 1 US / 2.25 mm recommended or size needed to obtain stated gauge.

## Gauge

8 stitches per inch over stockinette stitch.
