# Lacy Serpentine Scarf

Lacy Serpentine Scarf is knit side-to-side along its length in an amazingly easy lace pattern that looks more complicated than it really is.

The serpentine lace stitch has only three different patterned rows, so the rhythm is quickly learned and enjoyed.

To knit the scarf, you merely cast on for one side of the scarf, then work the easily memorized pattern in long rows. Before you know it, you've knit across the scarf and are ready to bind off for the other side.

#### **Finished Size**

71" by 9" after tension blocking (180.34 cm by 22.86 cm); guidance for adjusting the size of the scarf is included in the project instructions

#### Yarn

400 yards (365 m) laceweight; if adjusting scarf size, plan for correspondingly more or less yarn

### Gauge

17 stitches x 32 rows = 4" (10 cm) blocked

# **Knitting Needles**

Size US 4 (3.5 mm) suggested

#### **Other Notions**

Tapestry needle for finishing ends

Blocking board; rust-proof blocking wires/pins

Knit, purl, yarn over, cast on, bind off

Knitted side to side; no seams to sew
