## SAMPLE Lacy Riverine

An elegant coordinating set of reversible lace scarf, headband, and mitts or muffatees to keep neck, head, hands and arms warm on cool days. The undulating lacy design is reminiscent of a softly flowing river on quiet afternoons. With just two simple lace pattern rows that repeat, any of these items would be suitable for even a beginning lace knitter to make.



The Lacy Riverine pattern stitches are designed to be reversible and near-reversible, giving you the bonus of being attractive on both sides. Therefore, your Lacy Riverine set coordinates no matter which side of the fabric is worn to the outside.

For Lacy Riverine set in either the smaller size (pictured) or larger size, use 3 balls elann.com Collection Super Kydd, 70% super kid mohair/30% nylon, 25 g (.875 oz) balls - 237.5 m (259 yds). Pictured models knitted by Wannietta Prescod of Canadian Guild of Knitters.

Gauge (after light blocking)	6 sts/inch over Riverine-20 pattern stitch	6 sts/inch over Riverine-8 pattern stitch	6 sts/inch over Riverine-8 pattern stitch
